SITUATION IN BAHRAIN — ISSUE 1

RIGHT TO NATIONALITY

18 recommandations

To eliminate/end all discrimination against women. All supported by the government.

Bahraini nationality is still only transmitted through the male line.

Bahrain only extended this provision in **extremely limited** circumstances through exceptional royal decrees.



Amend the Bahrain Citizenship Act to allow Bahraini women married to non-Bahrainis to pass their citizenship onto their children as they voluntarily pledged in 2017.

Continue reinstating the nationalities of individuals who had theirs arbitrarily revoked.

Create a system by which the government can collect information and track the remaining cases of statelessness in Bahrain and the profiles of these various stateless groups.

NATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS MECHANISMS

12 recommandations

On the effectiveness & independence of institutions meant to investigate allegations of mistreatment & torture.

Supported; however, failed to operationalize many of these recommendations.

Ensure redress for human rights violations victims and an end to the "culture of impunity

Ensure the complete independence of these bodies

Adopt a transparent and merit-based mechanism for the screening, selection, and appointment staff for limited terms that involves a public call



Establish a transparent follow-up mechanism for the recommendations of these institutions, ensuring that responsibility for failure to address the violations committed is determined;

Allow a periodic impartial review of their work by an autonomous body.



SITUATION IN BAHRAIN — ISSUE 3

FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION

Recommendation 114.98 114.104 On protection of freedom of speech online.

Supported yet not implemented as Bahrain continues to prosecute individuals who voice their opinions online.



Repeal or substantially amend legislation, decrees, or other regulations that permit expansive restrictions on free expression & free press.

Limit the censorship power of the Information Affairs Authority (IAA) & other media oversight bodies, and allow foreign press to report freely on Bahrain.

Eliminate arbitrary & redundant licensing policies for media outlets & journalists, and cease mass online filtering & reinstate arbitrarily blocked websites.
