Recommendations made during UPR III

Supported: 129.69 (Hungary) and 129.70 (Lebanon)

Suggested recommendation for UPR IV:

- Repeal or amend article 87 of the Penal Code with a concise definition of terrorist acts;
- Limit the period of initial police custody to a maximum of 48 hours, including in terrorism-related cases;
- End the use of terrorism accusations to crackdown on peaceful dissent.

Torture and ill-treatment



Recommendations made during UPR III:

Accepted: 129.76 (Bosnia and Herzegovina) Accepted (as already implemented): 129.77 (Chile)

Suggested recommendation for UPR IV:

- Revise the Code of Criminal Procedure (CPP) to clearly integrate the invalidity of confessions
 extracted under torture and make it fully compliant with Articles 2 and 15 UNCAT and article 9-4
 ICCPR;
- Conduct thorough and impartial investigations into all allegations of ill-treatment and violence during arrests, including in the event of the death of the person detained, and communicate the results at least to the families of the victims.

Right to truth & fight against impunity



Recommendations made during UPR III:

Supported (as already implemented): 129.78 (Israel)

Suggested recommendations for UPR IV:

- Ratify ICPPED and Rome Statutes;
- Implement views of the HRCt and outstanding cases of the WGEID;
- Allow the WGEID to conduct an in-country visit;
- Repeal articles 45 and 46 of Ordinance 06-01 to guarantee victims' right to truth and accountability for perpetrators;
- Establish a national truth-seeking commission;
- End judicial harassment against individuals and organizations seeking justice for crimes committed in the 1990s

Independence of the judiciary & violations of the right to a fair trial



Recommendations made during UPR III:

Supported (as already implemented): 129.81 (Spain), 129.82 (Angola), 129.83 (Maldives), 129.85(Burundi)

Suggested recommendations for UPR IV:

- Ensure that judicial bodies such as the CSM and the Constitutional Court are fully independent;
- Stop sanctioning or prosecuting lawyers and members of the judiciary for their work, trade union activity or other peaceful activism;
- Ensure that the Penal Code/Code of Criminal Procedure are in full compliance with Articles
 9 and 14 ICCPR, in legislation and in practice;
- Put an end to abusive practices of pre-trial detention, hasty trials and trials in absentia.
